ABI Bankruptcy Appeals Manual: Winning Your Bankruptcy Appeal (ABI-BANKAM)

Discusses all of the “must know” issues relevant to an appeal, including choosing the proper forum, standing, timing, standards for review and stays pending appeal. Also provides guidance on drafting appellate pleadings and presenting an effective appellate argument.

ABI Guide to Bankruptcy Mediation, 2d (ABI-BKRMED)

Focusing on the intersection between bankruptcy law and ERISA, this timely resource helps business bankruptcy professionals reconcile the tensions between the code and benefits law. It incorporates BAPCPA provisions, as well as the Pension Protection Act of 2006.

Auto Supplier Insolvencies & Bankruptcies: Issues for Suppliers and Customers of Financially Troubled Auto Suppliers (ABI-AUTO)

Provides strategies for buyers and sellers in the supply chain both prior to and subsequent to a supplier’s bankruptcy filing. Offers suggestions for legal strategies, including discussions of Article 2 of the Uniform Commercial Code as it relates to automotive suppliers and customers, accommodation agreements, access and security agreements, parts banks, and special tooling lien acts – both pre- and post-BAPCPA.

Bankruptcy – A Survival Guide for Lenders, 2d (ABI-BASGL)

Developed specifically to assist lenders in understanding the bankruptcy process in business and consumer cases, and their role in that process. Features practical advice geared toward the protection of lenders’ interests during a bankruptcy case, and glossaries of both bankruptcy terms and bankruptcy cases, as well as a list of commonly asked questions.

Covers the basics of IP law, including a description of property rights, license and assignment issues, and infringements. Outlines what parties can do in a bankruptcy to protect intellectual property rights, including the DIP’s ability to assign IP licenses.

Bankruptcy in Practice, Fourth Edition (ABI-BKRPRAC)

Bridges the divide between classroom theory, courtroom procedure and conference room negotiation. Doctrine and practical counsel are blended in a unique treatment of bankruptcy law and process. For nonspecialist lawyers and nonlawyer professionals, this resource demystifies the arcane rules of the bankruptcy road.

Bankruptcy Issues for Commercial Landlords, Tenants and Mortgages, 2d (ABI-BICLTM)

This manual has been updated to include new cases and issues arising under BAPCPA as well as in other areas where there has been significant development of the law – including letters of credit, landlord claims and the calculation of the statutory cap for such claims.

Bankruptcy Issues for State Trial Court Judges, Third Edition (ABI-STCTJ)

This resource covers the 2005 amendments to the code – including concepts such as property of the estate, claims, bankruptcy stays and injunctions, dischargeability, domestic-relations law, criminal proceedings and the structure of the bankruptcy court system.

Bankruptcy Telecommunications Manual, 2d (ABI-TELECOM)

Examines the interrelationship and conflict between the Communication Act and the Bankruptcy Code – covering such issues as discontinuation of service, interconnection, nondiscrimination in delivery of service, transfer and assignment of FCC licenses, and more.

Creditors' Committee Manual, Fifth Edition (ABI-CCOM)

Covers the role, function and responsibilities of committees and committee members, and explores complex issues in nontechnical, easily understood language.

European Union Regulation on Insolvency Proceedings: An Introductory Analysis, 2d (ABI-EUREG)

A primer that covers jurisdictional issues, "winding-up" procedures such as the appointment of a liquidator, recognition of judgments, creditors' rights and other provisions. An invaluable resource for professionals who find themselves increasingly involved in cross-border insolvency cases.

Preference Defense Handbook: The Circuits Compared (ABI-PREF)

Designed to assist practitioners and credit professionals in evaluating the available defenses that may be asserted in a preference avoidance action. The authors review the leading cases in each circuit, interpret the most common defenses, and provide a helpful road map for those facing preference demands.

Retention and Payment: Essentials of Being Retained and Paid as Debtor's Counsel in Chapter 11 (ABI-RETPAY)

Provides important practice pointers on obtaining court approval of the retention as debtor's bankruptcy counsel and obtaining court approval to be paid for services rendered to the debtor. A must-have for attorneys who may be generally unfamiliar with the chapter 11 process but who find themselves representing chapter 11 debtors.

When Worlds Collide: Bankruptcy and Its Impact on Domestic Relations and Family Law, Third Edition (ABI-DOMREL)

Divorce and bankruptcy are alike in that each attempts to provide a "fresh start," but the laws are often in conflict. This resource helps family court judges better identify and deal with bankruptcy issues, such as the impact of the automatic stay, the power of the courts to enjoin state courts, property of the bankruptcy estate, the impact of the bankruptcy discharge on alimony, child support, maintenance and property settlements, post-petition divorce actions, and exempt property.
